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BUREAU FOR PRIVATE POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION TO ASSIST FOUR-D COLLEGE STUDENTS

SACRAMENTO – Staff from the Department of Consumer Affairs' Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education will be in Riverside and Apple Valley on Friday July 17 to advise students of Four-D College's Colton and Victorville locations about their options in the wake of the school's apparent closure.

Bureau staff will provide students with applications for the state's Student Tuition Recovery fund and information about getting federal student loans discharged. They will also assist students in obtaining their transcripts, financial aid documents and other important records.

Staff from the Bureau will be on-site from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the following locations:

- Riverside – 3737 Main Street, Arlington Room
- Apple Valley – 13467 Navajo Road

"Our hearts go out to the students affected by the closure of Four-D College," said Bureau Chief Joanne Wenzel. "The Bureau's top priority in the coming days will be to provide every bit of help to them that we can during this uncertain time."
